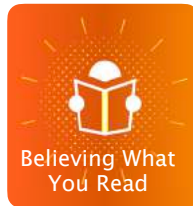

Digital Citizenship - A Prerequisite for 1:1 Success

Students do not see peer posts until after they post. This ensures that ALL students participate, increasing engagement and broadening perspectives. Teachers guide in-class dialogue based on this student input.

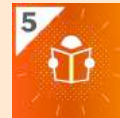



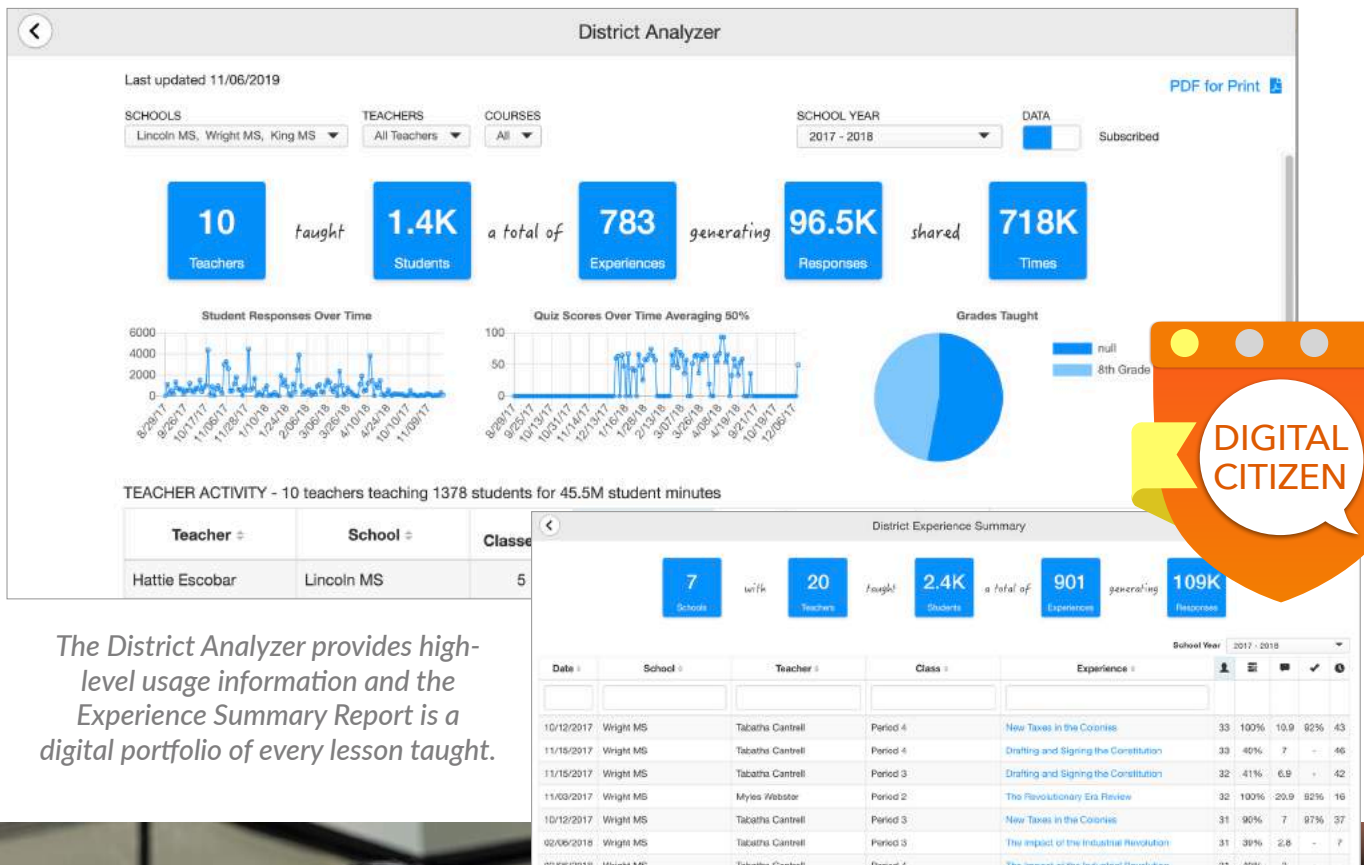
